DNA of Good Decisions

Jim Collins (researcher, teacher, business leader) combed through 14 years of research to create his book "Good to Great".

Here are some things he learned about the DNA of good decisions.

- Great decisions come from saying "I don't know". And then finding out.
- The higher the questions/statements ratio, the better. I made heroes out of those on my team who identified flaws in my thinking. At the next meeting, I might say: "I really want to give Leigh credit. She really pushed my thinking and I wasn't looking at this right."
- Deciding is not about consensus. Debate can occur, but in the end, the leader makes the decision. No major decision we've studied was ever taken at a point of unanimous agreement.
- Think long-term. Real managers lead for a quarter-century-not the quarter.
- You can make mistakes even big ones-and prevail. What a relief.
